On behalf of the Sinnissippi Foundation Board of Directors, thank you for your support during 2009. The assistance from you and many others provides the Foundation with the energy and needed resources to continue its support of the work and mission of Sinnissippi Centers as it provides behavioral health care to the children, teens, adults and families here in northwest Illinois. The Foundation is also able to continue its support of community projects it values.

A look back at the past 365 days of 2009 is provided inside this annual report. Every week the Foundation is leaving its impression - providing emergency assistance via the CARES Fund for a family who has been told that at the end of the month they will no longer have a place to live...providing 111 client families with a food basket during Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter holidays...making 32 grant awards in support of programs and projects in the communities that are served by the Foundation and Sinnissippi Centers.

On the horizon is a new public awareness campaign on a timely topic - prescription drug abuse. Youth and young adults locally and across the United States are misusing prescription medications - either their own or someone else's - thinking they are a safer alternative to illicit drugs. Planting a seed and growing it

Like a seed, the idea was planted and carefully nurtured until it bloomed in the full sunlight of the summer.

Bud and Lisa LeFevre of Distinctive Gardens in Dixon approached Sinnissippi Centers and the Sinnissippi Foundation last spring with an idea for Gardenstock, a music and art event, with all proceeds from this first time event going to support Sinnissippi's Community Youth Garden Project, which was initiated four years ago through a Foundation grant.

On August 22nd, the first ever "Gardenstock Music and Art Festival" was held at Distinctive Gardens, with more than 600 persons attending the day long celebration.

"I've always wanted to use the grounds of the business for a fundraising event like this," explains Bud. "We were amazed at the turnout and couldn't have asked for a better day of weather. Really we couldn't be more thrilled with the outcome."

Five bands played during the day including Flying Fish, Anne and Maggie Hilliard, Merlin, Wrong Element and Acoustic Circus.

"I have ten bands who've asked to be involved next time. It's going to be hard to change this event because we love the connection between the Garden Project and the work we do here at Distinctive Gardens."

In the end, \$2,446 was raised through Gardenstock to support Sinnissippi's Garden Project.

"Thanks to Bud and Lisa and everyone involved with Distinctive Gardens for such a great idea, we hope to continue this wonderful partnership for many years," explains Jim Sarver.

Special thanks also goes to Jim Brown, Baker Street, Culver's of Dixon, Salamandra's, BOGO Sound, Tim Goral, Hope Greene, Cathy Heng, Chuck Hilliard, Sydni Reubin, Leland Sedig, and all the volunteers.

Coming home

In recent years, former employees of Sinnissippi Centers have played a limited role in regular agency and Foundation events. On May 8th, the Foundation hosted the "First Gathering of Alumni" during a dinner and program at The Next Picture Show. The gathering was a strategic effort to welcome alumni participation in Sinnissippi events and activities, and to also educate them about the mission of the Foundation.

Gardenstock

Initiated four years ago as a project of Sinnissippi Centers' Court Intensive Youth Services program, the Community Youth Garden Project got a huge shot in the arm in August 2009 as Distinctive Gardens of Dixon hosted Gardenstock, an all day music and art event, with proceeds directly supporting the garden project. **See left side bar column for additional information on Gardenstock.**

Sharing the holiday spirit

During 2009, the Foundation brightened the Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays of 111 client families (414 family members) who received a holiday basket filled with traditional food items. For many of these families, the holidays would otherwise have passed without a time of shared celebration.

Paying it forward

Every year, the Foundation provides an annual award to the supervised living apartments of Sinnissippi Centers in Dixon, Mt. Carroll, Rochelle and Sterling. The tenants of these facilities are able to receive additional matching funds (dollar for dollar) from the Foundation if they hold a fundraiser during that year. Those funds are often then used for tenant activities throughout the year. In recent years, tenants have chosen to use a portion of their funds to sponsor a local family in need, buying presents and food items at Christmas time.

Swinging for a cause

Blue skies and warm temperatures greeted 136 golfers during the Foundation's 17th Annual Sinnissippi Foundation Golf Open, held August 13th at Timber Creek Golf Club in Dixon. The Golf Open is the largest fundraiser for the Foundation, which honored Sauk Valley Bank and Grot Imaging Studio with the Sponsor of the Year Award. The 18th Annual Golf Open will be held August 12, 2010, again at Timber Creek Golf Club.



Granting help to many

As a way of giving back to the community at large, the Foundation in 2009 awarded 32 grants (valued at \$7,800) to programs of Sinnissippi Centers as well as community agencies. Funding was provided to the:

- 15th Judicial Circuit Family Violence Coordinating Conference
- 15th Judicial Circuit Probation Conference;
- Client scholarships to the national Depression and BiPolar Conference in Indianapolis;
- Family Focus and Adolescent Anger Management Groups
- Support to the C.R.I.K.E.T. after school program and the "Tools for School" project.

Funding requests are considered monthly and limited to projects within Carroll, Lee, Ogle and Whiteside Counties.

Teaching character

Students in selected Lee and Whiteside county schools received character education workbooks thanks to the efforts of the Foundation. The workbooks from Family Traditions are used to teach valuable character lessons, with the students keeping the workbooks at the end the program.

Commitment of caring

Since 2002, the Foundation has provided emergency assistance to clients of Sinnissippi Centers via the CARES Fund. More than \$3,500 in emergency funding was provided during 2009, with many of those requests involving:

- housing assistance
- transportation assistance
- paying utility expenses
- providing clothing
- prescription co-pays
- house and vehicle repairs

Expression of help

The art hanging on the wall of the art gallery provides purchasers with an opportunity to take home a great piece of art while helping those with a behavioral health need. The 6th Annual Expressions Art Sale will begin Monday, April 12th and conclude with a gala event on the evening of Friday, April 23rd. Expressions will again be hosted at The Next Picture Show (113 West First Street, Dixon). In addition to the sale of quality art pieces, this fundraiser will feature a silent auction. For the second straight year, Sauk Valley Bank is co-sponsoring Expressions.



Development of new awareness campaign

The beginning of 2010 witnessed the unveiling of a new public awareness campaign focused on a growing problem among teens and young adults. These young persons may believe that misusing or abusing a prescribed medication is safer than an illegal drug. That is just not true. The campaign will feature the story of Alex Wolf, a 23 year old from Rock Falls, who died suddenly after an accidental intoxication of the pain reliever, Oxycodone. **See side bar story for more details.**

Assistance now for tomorrow's nurses

Their role in behavioral health care may not always be recognized, but nurses play a regular daily role in helping those with a mental health or substance use disorder. 2010 marks the 8th year that the Foundation will provide scholarship assistance to nursing students, many of whom graduate from the program at Sauk Valley Community College. Annually, the Foundation awards two \$1,000 Nursing Scholarships. Applications for the 2010-2011 nursing scholarships at SVCC can be picked up from the guidance office.

A prescription for disaster

As this group of six young men below were positioned by the photographer for their picture, another friend was tragically missing. 23 year old Alex Wolf of Rock Falls is not there. This young man passed away August 7, 2009, from an accidental intoxication of the pain reliever Oxycodone.

Could this tragedy have been avoided? Most likely. Alex's family and friends realize that it's too late to save him, but it's not too late to help others.

The family, in collaboration with the Sinnissippi Foundation and Sinnissippi Centers, has spearheaded the creation of a new public awareness campaign on prescription drug abuse, which is greatly impacting teens and young adults.

"Alex was funny, sensitive and caring, but he also suffered from anxiety," explains his mother, Tamara Wolf. "Until you love someone who struggles with worries, fears and disruptive thoughts, you cannot begin to understand their daily struggle. He simply wanted to feel better. Alex always tried to do the right thing and be the best person he could be."

"In the moments we miss Alex the most, we know that this awareness campaign is the best thing we can do in his memory."

"We want to dispel the stigma attached to mental illness and secondly, we want to destroy the belief system among teens and young adults, that abuse of prescription drugs is safer than using illicit drugs. It's just not true."

1 in 4 teens know someone (a friend or acquaintance) who currently misuses a prescribed medication for the intent purpose of getting high.

The public awareness campaign, entitled "A Prescription for Disaster", will include radio and billboard messages as well as posters that will be distributed to area schools. A training of local professionals is also being planned for 2010.
